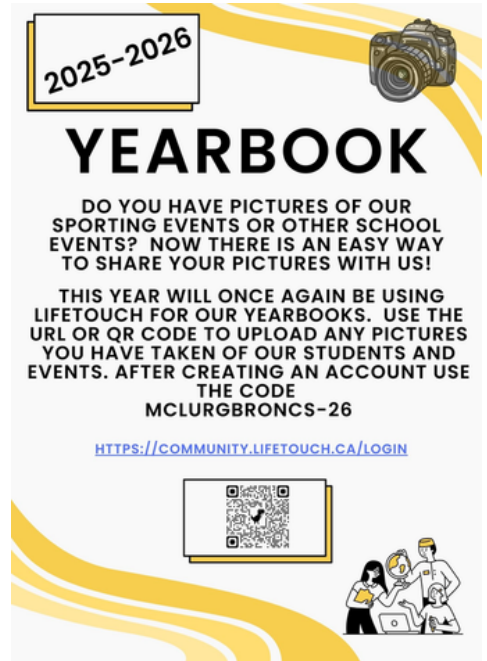

## Emergency Services 20

The past two weeks, students in Emergency Services wrapped up their place-based learning. On Friday, May 22nd, students went to STARs air ambulance, as well as Saskatchewan Air Ambulance. At both locations, they toured the facilities, sat in the aircraft, spoke with the mechanics and pilots, as well as engaged in learning in both simulation locations. It was excellent to have an opportunity to connect with both the flight nurses and paramedics to ask questions and see what their responsibilities are. While at STARs, students got to witness what it looks like when a call is received and the process and decisions that go into a team being dispatched. In the afternoon while watching a simulation, air ambulance received a call, so the students were able to see the aircraft getting taxied out, as well as the preparation involved. It was an amazing day of learning and an experience that will be remembered for years to come.

On Wednesday, May 27th, students teamed up with Spiritwood High School to participate in Search and Rescue training with Lavan and his team from Corman Park. There was a lot of learning connecting to training involved in SAR, treatments including hypowrap for infants and adults, key components in a survival pack, the difference between rescue and recovery, the acronym SAME (search, access, medical, evacuate), what critical distance is, as well as various types of searches. It was a very engaging day for both staff and students. Everyone left the training with smiles on their face and another great day of memories.







## Emergency Services 20 - Fire Dept. Wrap Up

On Tuesday, May 5th, students in Emergency Services wrapped up their seven weeks of place-based learning with the Wilkie Fire Department. It was a morning of applying all of their knowledge that they had gained into an obstacle course that consisted of a variety of stations. Students were dressed in full gear while going through the course. With assistance where needed, students got the hoses ready and had to knock targets off of pails with a charged hose. They then moved onto carrying ladders properly and getting up and down the correct way. Choosing the right tools for entry into a building, then to using the jaws of life to move tennis balls was the next station. Unrolling and rolling hoses was the second last station before students moved onto using a fire extinguisher properly to put out a small fire. This day would not have been possible without the guidance of the Wilkie Fire Chief, Mr. Randy Elder and his team. A huge shout out to all of the members that took time out of their days during our learning to make learning so meaningful.





## Social Studies 9

Mr. Marek

The grade 9 Social Studies class has been learning about Ancient Rome. One of our projects involves creating bulletin boards about famous (but not so nice) Roman empresses. As part of the study the girls took two class periods to try genuine Roman hairstyles. Most all women in Ancient Rome had long hair, which of course would get in the way during a busy day. There are a number of hairstyles which appear regularly on ancient coins and various art works dating back to Rome. We chose to try two styles.

In Rome, hairstyles were held together using yarn, which was sewn into the hair. One of our students, Cadence, volunteered to have her hair done in a more difficult style which often appeared on Roman coins. Mrs. Sittler took on the task, as she used to be a hairdresser. The style involved lots of twists and braids which ended up in a tightly bound wreath of hair at the back. Empresses had slave girls that specialized in taking care of their mistress's hair, and apparently, they could complete more complicated hair styles in less than half an hour. Cadence was a great sport about it; especially when it took more time to untangle the yarn than it did to create the do. In the end the style had her looking like a true Roman empress or princess.

After completing Cadence's hair, the girls opted for a traditional but easier to do style. They chose to use elastics instead of yarn to speed the process. Ancient Roman woman would have had no such option. The simpler style would have been common on the streets of Ancient Rome. One of our students even practiced and managed to complete the style at home without any help from an assistant.

On a second day, the grade 9 girls styled a number of high school and junior girls. They were quick, efficient, and had the style down to an art.





## Fish in Schools Release

On Thursday, May 28<sup>th</sup>, our fish were released into Scott Reservoir. Mr. Myszczyzyn's grade 7 class spent a few hours at the reservoir fishing and having a wiener roast. Charlie Sittler assisted with managing the students as they explored the area. The students didn't catch any trout, but did manage to hook some ticks.

We were met at the reservoir by two conservation officers who gave a brief description of the trout operation at the reservoir.

The release went smoothly, and much to our delight, the fish swam into the pond as frisky as could be. Amazingly, they stayed schooled up. While we were there, we could see the occasional school of similar sized trout fingerlings swimming just off shore.

We would like to thank Ms. L'Hoir for setting up the entire project, and Mr. Marek and Mr. Myszczyzyn for nurturing the fish along. Overall we raised about 85 trout out of an original 100 eggs. Funding was provided by the Unity and Wilkie Wildlife Federations; for which we are very grateful. Mr. Myszczyzyn plans on running the program again next year.

## Senior Badminton

Sr. Badminton wrapped up this past month with an outstanding finish to the season. Two teams competed at Regionals in Warman, and both advanced to Provincials at Walter Murray Collegiate.

**Mixed Doubles – Emerson and Mere:** At Regionals, Emerson and Mere finished pool play with two wins and one loss, placing them second in their pool and advancing to playoffs. They defeated Lloydminster in the crossover match to earn a spot in the gold medal final against Centennial. They had a strong performance and won in 3 games, becoming the Mixed Doubles Region D Champions.

At Provincials, they also finished second in their pool with two wins and one loss. After falling to MJ Central in the crossover match, they competed against Campbell in the bronze medal match and finished an impressive 4<sup>th</sup> in Saskatchewan.

**Girls Doubles – Brynlee and Alivia:** At Regionals, Brynlee and Alivia also finished with two wins and one loss in pool play, earning second place in their pool. They defeated Medstead in the crossover match to advance to the gold medal final against Walter Murray, where they earned silver and secured their spot at Provincials.

At Provincials, they repeated their pool play performance with two wins and one loss to advance to playoffs. After facing Walter Murray once again in the crossover and coming up short, they battled Kipling in the bronze medal match. Brynlee and Alivia pushed the match to three games and came away with the win, earning the title of Girls Doubles Bronze Medalists.

A special thank you goes out to Cheyanne Cey and Josh Tatton for helping prepare our athletes for playoffs, as well as Cole and CJ for continuing to come out and support the team.
